

### Mission:

Assist the BCMA Board in evaluating the community's existing facilities, including roads, drainage, buildings, pools, etc. Prioritize and recommend replacements, repairs, functionality

upgrades and the associated costs.

### **Near Term Objectives:**

- 1) Renovate swimming pool chemical storage room.
- 2) Commence implementation of the pavement management plan.

### **Current Status:**

Swimming pool chemical storage room renovation.

Presently interviewing contractors for design study preparation.

Pavement management plan. The Board hired an engineering consultant to prepare a plan that will provide prioritization of the works, street by street, and the associated costs.

Perimeter security wall improvements. Architect's

recommendations received. Next step: present recommendations to the community.

Main security gate renovation. In conjunction with the Access Control Committee, the next steps are to prepare an Engineer's cost estimate and present recommendations to the community.

### **Meet ALLISON JOHNSON** Nordic Director of Security



Congratulations to Allison Johnson who, after two years with Nordic Security in Bear Creek, has recently been promoted to Bear Creek's Post Commander, Director of Security.

### **NEW INITIATIVES**

In her new role, Allison immediately put into place changes to remedy one of the critical problems at the main security gate. The early morning queue of vendor and services vehicles on the corner of Clinton Keith has been streamlined by posting security personnel curbside to check driver's licenses and gate passes. This has allowed a more efficient entry process and keeps the residents' lane clear.

Another initiative is an uptick in random checks at the community center gyms, pool, and courts. Residents are reminded that they must accompany their guests while using these facilities.

### **MAIN RESPONSIBILITIES**

What else is Allison up to? "My new responsibilities are

many. Supervision of staff, addressing residents' concerns, preparing daily reports, reviewing citations. The buck stops with me," said Allison.

After several years working security at the Temecula Town Center Shopping Mall, Allison is thrilled to be in Bear Creek. "I like the people," she says. "Bear Creek residents take a genuine interest in the community's security and what we, the Nordic staff, do. It's a team effort and the residents support us."

### A FAMILY OF NINE

Born and raised in Burbank, Allison now resides in Murrieta with her wife and seven children who range in age from 5 to 26. Allison participates in her schoolaged children's virtual home schooling. Two cats and one dog round out the household. The cats, Luna and Amethyst, are rescues, and Hermione is a terrier mix. "They are just your average animals and get along great," says Allison.

# GARDENING, ANTHROPOLOGY AND THE ART OF FINE PASTRY

Allison has many interests outside of work, including gardening. "I've turned our backyard into a vegetable farm. We started growing to reduce food costs, and it became a passion," she says. "Zucchini and peppers are what we tend to grow the

most of. The kids help with garden care and harvesting." Her philosophy: "Everyone who lives on the farm works on the farm."

Otherwise, Allison says, "I don't have much free time to speak of because I am in an undergraduate program at Mt. San Jacinto College studying anthropology with a focus in archaeology." Allison's previous academic pursuits include an Associate of Arts degree in real estate from Kaplan University and an Associate of Science degree in classical pastry and baking from Le Cordon Bleu College of Culinary Arts in Pasadena.

### **VOLUNTEERING**

Allison continued, "When I do have time, the kids and I volunteer with Oceana, The Dolphin Project and Sea Shepherd. Also, I have a keen interest in, and have educated myself in, inclusivity and intersectionality.

# INTERSECTIONALITY, INCLUSION, COMMUNICATION

What is intersectionality and inclusion? In the context of diversity and inclusion, intersectionality describes the interconnected relationship of social categorizations (such as race, gender, and sexual orientation) as applied to an individual or a group.

Allison explains, "I saw a need for people to be able to

communicate their struggles without diminishing or dismissing the struggles of others. We all navigate the world in a different way, but we often face similar obstacles. When we can open those lines of communication, we can see that we are all deserving of time and space and compassion. Through listening, we can learn how some in our population have been harmed by others and begin to repair and heal those wounds and enact change to prevent further trauma. I learned about, and got involved in this work, through my wife, who is a rabbi."

Allison admits there are often challenges to being an LGBTQ family and balances that with clarity of purpose, mutual understanding, and active communication. "I am very proud of what we have accomplished as contributing members of the community."

"I am very happy to be here," said Allison – and Bear Creek is fortunate to have


### **Pool Season**

The warm weather continues, and our community has a beautiful swimming pool available to all residents and their guests.

Here are a few things to remember when using the Bear Creek Community Center Pool:

- Daily pool hours, 5 a.m. to 11 p.m.
- NO LIFEGUARD ON DUTY.
- All children under the age of 14 must be accompanied by an adult resident at least 18 years of age.
- Please be courteous to other swimmers while in the pool area. Foul language and belligerent behavior will not be tolerated.
- For the safety of all residents and guests,

- swimmers should utilize the "buddy system."
- No pets are allowed anywhere in the pool area with the exception of service animals.
- Absolutely no alcohol is permitted in the pool area. Smoking and chewing tobacco are also prohibited.
- One resident household is allowed to bring no more than four guests to the pool. Residents must always accompany their guests. Each homeowner is responsible for the conduct of their children and guests.
- Please note that the pool is unsupervised and there is NO LIFEGUARD ON DUTY. All people using the facilities do so at their own risk.
